COURSE AIM

This program aims to enhance the surgical skills required for minor surgical procedures most likely to be carried out by GPs in rural or remote settings where specialists are not readily available.

All General Practitioners, particularly those in rural or remote areas.

OBJECTIVES

On completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- Perform a range of emergency procedures including surgical airway management, intercostal drainage & intraosseous infusion
- Outline the principles of pain management with upper and lower limb nerve blocks and be able to administer a range of injections (eg intramuscular, intracapsular)
- Undertake surgery on skin lesions demonstrating the principles of excision margins, wound management & closure, nerve & vascular structure
- Outline the principles of suprapubic & lumbar punctures
- Outline the management of minor ophthalmic presentations (eg eyelid cysts, corneal foreign bodies)
- Manage a range of orthopaedic-related trauma presentations

COURSE OUTLINE

INJECTIONS AND NERVE BLOCKS

- Intramuscular, subcutaneous, intra-articular, joints
- Upper limb digital nerve blocks and carpal tunnel injection
- Lower limb peripheral and deep nerve blocks
- Penile nerve block

SKIN PROCEDURES

- Incisions & excisions
- Suturing techniques & closure
- Specific skin lesions (eg subcutaneous cysts, perianal haematoma etc)
- Haemorrhoids & peri-anal conditions
- Ingrown toenails (wedge resection, phenol).

PUNCTURES

- Lumbar puncture
- Intercostal drainage
- Cricothyroid puncture and Airway procedures
- Suprapubic.

VASCULAR ACCESS

- IV cannulation
- Venous cutdown
- Arterial puncture
- Intra-osseous.

FOREIGN BODIES IN THE EYE

- Eyelid conditions
- Corneal foreign bodies.

ORTHOPAEDICS

- X-ray review
- Fractures & reductions
- Dislocations
- Managing complications
- Plastering techniques.
